An incident was reported to the authority that occurred in an area of Liverpool that is a distance from our school, concerning a man behaving suspiciously by a school. This does not pose any danger to us but reminds us to be extra careful and monitor where our children are.

The school will not apologise for being extra careful with your children. Please remind them about the danger of strangers. School will take every caution on releasing your child from school. We must remind you that we will not do so if we do not have permission from you directly, in an emergency, or via your nominated people on your forms. If these names have changed please inform the school. We do not want your child upset by refusing to allow them to go with an unknown adult but we do want them safe.

### **URGENT SAFEGUARDING NOTICE**

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#### Help us to keep your children safe.

It has come to our attention that some parents / carers of children in Year 1 and Year 2 are accompanying their children through the gate and into the classroom, in the morning. We must ask you NOT to **do this.** Your child's safety is our priority. The staff cannot guarantee they recognise any adult who may drop the child off at school, strangers may be on our school site in the morning and seeing this happen, may attempt to enter the school in this way.

It is a sad reflection on these times but, in the interests of safeguarding, we must insist you do not pass the fence gate with your child. Your child should enter the school, in their line, with their friends. A member of staff will ensure that your child goes safely into class.

If you wish to speak to your child's teacher, in more detail than a guick chat on the line at 9.00 would allow, then please call in the office and make an appointment.

Communication between you and your child's teacher is important to us but we would be neglecting our responsibility to your child if we allowed this to continue and put the children at risk.
