This week in Nursery the children have continued to learn about Autumn and have looked closely at the artist, Alma Thomas. Using acrylic paints Alma Thomas created a beautiful Autumnal painting called, 'Leaves Fluttering in the Breeze'. The children talked about what they could see in the painting and were able to describe how it looks like the Autumn leaves falling from the tree. Then using water colours and paint brushes the children created the background. They mixed blue and yellow to make green and talked about how the colours changed. Once this was dry they added the leaves using poster paints and their fingers. The children had so much fun creating their Art work and feel really proud to have it displayed in our Nursery gallery.

In Maths we have also been looking at colours through various matching games. The children went on a hunt outside to find things that were green and red. Everyone was eager to find as many things as they could to match the correct colour and place it in the matching hoop. We talked about how when something 'matches' it is the 'same'. We also found Autumn treasures that matched and talked about the similarities and differences.



IN RECEPTION THIS WEEK

We have been working super hard this week completing our final sounds from phase 2. We have learned I,II and ss. Please practise these sounds at home with your child. In maths we have been looking at ways to make 4 and ways to make 5. The children looked at breaking the numbers up, for example 1 + 4 = 5 but so does 3 + 2.

We began rehearsing our Nativity, "Mary's knitting" songs this week". The children really enjoyed listening to the songs and we will be practising more next week.

This week we also did an experiment to make an indoor rainbow using a mirror, torch and tank of water. The children were so excited that we managed to make a rainbow inside. It is part of our topic on light and dark. We also did a little quiz on this which we all enjoyed.

On Friday 3rd December 2021, we are asking you to wear red, blue, green or orange clothing (the colours of the emergency services) and **donate £1** towards the 999 Cenotaph.

The 999 Cenotaph will be the UK's first monument to honour everybody who has served in the NHS and emergency services.

This is a one-off campaign, for a once in a lifetime monument to our 999 and NHS heroes.

About the Emergency Services Cenotaph



- We are raising at least E3.2 million to build the UK's first 999 Cenotaph dedicated to everybody who has served in the NHS and emergency services.
- Almost 2 million people (including 250,000 first responders) serve in the emergency services today.
- The 999 Cenotaph will stand for 1,000 years on Whitehall, London. It will be 21ft tall.
- The design includes 6 figures representing the different emergency services, plus a dog to represent service animals.
- The 999 Cenotaph is proudly supported by HRH Prince William, Duke of Cambridge.
