Elizabeth was born on the 7th of September 1533 and was crowned on the 15th of January 1559; she reigned until her death in 1603. Elizabeth was the daughter of Henry the VIII (which meant she was a Tudor) and was fairer than her father and half siblings in government. When she was queen, it was known as the 'Golden HORRIBLE HISTORIES Age' as Sir Francis Drake let the English Navy to defeat the Spanish Armada (which was also known as his great beard). 

This week in Nursery we have been learning all about the number two. The children went on a number hunt around our Nursery to find the number two. They found the number two in the Maths area, water and construction area. The children learnt a special rhyme to help learn how to remember and write the number two - 'Around and back on a railroad track, two, two, two'. We counted two actions such as hops, claps and jumps and found our two eyes, two ears, two legs and two arms. The children then found two objects and matched them to the numeral. The children have been learning to count 1:1 by touching the object as they count.

Have a go at home at finding the number two when you go to the shops, the park or around your house. Take a photo and upload it to Tapestry.

This week we have also been learning more about 'People who help us'. We have been learning all about Firefighters this week and how they keep us safe. We talked about how brave and strong firefighters are. The children have enjoyed using junk modelling to create police cars, fire engines, postal vans and ambulances. They joined the boxes together using cello tape and glue then painted them using the correct colours.



IN RECEPTION THIS WEEK

In reception in phonics this week we have looked at the letters y, z, zz and ch please support your child practising these sounds at home when you can. In maths we have been looking at composition of numbers. How can we make different numbers in different ways? There are some activities on tapestry to help support this learning.

This week we decided to spread the happiness and we made some cakes to give to the nursery children. We followed a recipe and decorated them. The nursery children had such happy faces when we gave the cakes to them. We also made ourselves one too.
