### This Week's Subject: Geography

In Geography, children develop their knowledge of the world around them, taking into account the human and physical features. This starts in EYFS with children exploring the world around them and is included in many of the areas of learning. In Years 1-6, children develop knowledge of locations in their locality and the wider world.

This year, children in Year 3 have enjoyed learning about North America and South East Brazil. They investigated locations to learn more about them as well as developing map reading skills. They have loved playing games locating places and competing against each other to share their knowledge of North and South America. Adam in Year 3 said, "I like learning how to use maps and learning about different places. We get better at using the maps when we practise."
