This Week's Subject: Music



Our Music curriculum provides opportunities for children to develop their musical ear. Music is taught in three main strands - the history of music, instrumental focus and singing. We encourage our children to explore different genres and instruments within their lessons to gain an understanding of the world around them artistically. Singing and exploring skills are introduced to our children in EYFS as the essential elements which we progress and build on through to Year 6.

This half term, Key Stage 1 have been focusing on their Kodaly hand signs and transferring these to be able to play instruments such as Boomwhackers and chime bars. They will also be able to play along to the songs they have been singing.
