THIS WEEK IN PSHE

In assembly this week, our children were lucky enough to have a visit from our friends at Christ Church. They talked to our KS2 children about the Christmas Story and the importance of Jesus' birth.

In PSHE this week, we have been looking at recognising opinions and respecting different points of view.

Year 1 Phonics

This week in Phonics, Year 1 have been learning the Phase Five sounds 'oy' (enjoy, boy), 'ir' (girl, bird), 'ue' (glue, blue) and 'aw' (straw, lawn).

CURRICULUM CORNER


This Week's Subject: History

In History, pupils gain a knowledge and understanding of key events from the past. Sarah in Year 2 explained, "You learn about things in the past - if you didn't learn, people would do it again."

An important part in the development of pupils' historical knowledge is an understanding of chronology. This allows children to understand how key events have impacted on people and societies and the effects these have on shaping the world we live in today. Knowledge of chronology is developed through the use of timelines. This is introduced early on in Nursery and Reception through daily routine charts and moves more formally to a range of different timelines up to Year 6 where pupils place events and civilisations alongside each other for comparison.

Isabella recommends 'Angela Nicely' by Alan Macdonald.


'I like this book because it's all about a little girl's adventure. It's lots of fun. I would give it 9 out of 10!'



Attendance This Week

This week, we have had particularly low attendance. We understand there are bugs going round and the change in weather means that a lot of absence this week has been unavoidable, however there are still some instances where children are staying off where they are just slightly under the weather or staying off for a long time. Sometimes children may say they are sick if they are feeling tired or know they are doing something that day that isn't their favourite lesson. We will always contact you to collect your child if they really are unwell, so if your child is just a little rundown, please send them to school or contact the school office to discuss with Ms Segar or Miss Toole. Attendance and Punctuality

Children are expected to be in school, on time, every day unless they are unwell. All other reasons will be unauthorised. If your child is going to be absent, contact school and let us know before 8:30am. Children not in school may receive a phone call home or a home visit.

Registers are taken at 9.00 am (Key Stage 1 and Reception) or 08.55 am (Key Stage 2) by the class teacher. Class doors open ten minutes prior to this to allow a soft start to the day. Children arriving after this time will be marked as late.

Regularly missing the beginning of lessons has a negative impact on a child's progress and wellbeing.
