THIS WEEK IN PSHE

In assembly this week, we have been looking at Advent, and what this means (not just chocolate calendars!). In PSHE, we have continued to focus on our Autumn term topic of Relationships. This encompasses lots of different kind of relationships - family relationships, friendships and what constitutes a safe relationship. We have also had a big focus on respecting ourselves and others as part of this, and how respect forms a key part of relationship building.





his week in Phonics, Year 1 have been learning the 'wh' (when, whisker), 'ph' (phonics, dolphin), 'ew' (screw, new) and 'oe' (toe, goes).

We use strategies called mnemonics to help us remember which sounds these words are in:

'wh': whip with the whisk 'ph': pho<mark>to on a phone</mark> 'ew': the crew flew 'oe': tiptoe past the doe

CURRICULUM CORNER

This Week's Subject: Science

Science is a unique opportunity for children to explore, discover and investigate the world around them. A high-quality Science education provides the foundations for understanding the world through the

specific disciplines of biology, chemistry and physics. Science has changed our lives and is vital to the world's future prosperity, and all pupils should be taught essential aspects of the knowledge, methods, processes and uses of science. A key part of pupils' learning is through investigation where children are introduced to and explore key questions.

At Wellesbourne, pupils are introduced to scientific concepts in our EYFS setting through the Understanding the World strand. Opportunities linked to pupils' interests give them the chance to explore a range of concepts. This week, children have been looking at how and why ice forms and the processes involved in changing it back into water by melting.



Strawberry Fields Visit

For our final Y2 and Y3 Wellbeing Walk of the Autumn Term, we visited Strawberry Fields. We had a wonderful time walking around the gardens and learning more about John Lennon. It was very peaceful, and we even got to see the original gates!
