THIS WEEK IN PSHE

This week, Bully Busters have been into school to visit our KS2 classes. They focused on ensuring children understand the language around bullying—e.g. using the phrase 'someone has been unkind to me' rather than 'someone is bullying me'. They also talked about positive friendships, the role of a friend and choosing the right friend. Thank you, Bully Busters! In assembly this week, we focused on reminding ourselves of our school rules, and why we have them. Year 1 Phonics

week in Phonics, Year 1 have been earning split digraphs 'a e' (snake, game), 'e (concrete, theme), 'i e' (like, kite) and 'o e' (stone, hole). A split digraph is when two vowels are split by a consonant, causing them to make a long vowel sound instead of a short sound (time, same etc).

The mnemonics to help your child remember this week's sounds are:

'a e' - cake by the lake

'e_e' - the athletes compete

'i e' - time to shine

'o e' - note in the envelope

Spot the split digraphs in this sentence: The pine cone was seen next to the lake by Peter.

CURRICULUM CORNER

This Week's Subject: Science

Through our Science Curriculum, we encourage our

children to ask questions and discuss them to develop their learning. We ensure that the 'Working Scientifically' aspect of the curriculum is embedded

throughout, giving children the skills and confidence to explore ideas and consider what their results tell them about their learning. We believe that developing enquiry skills makes learning fun and supports pupils in remembering key concepts.

Year 5 have worked collaboratively to consider different ways forces work and how they can affect objects in different ways. They enjoyed finding out how the surface area of an object can affect the drag.


Year 5
