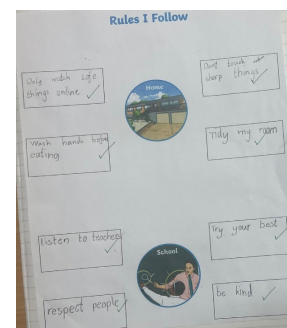


THIS WEEK IN PSHE

Year 1 Phonics

This week in Phonics, Year 1 have been learning the soft 'c' sound (mice, city). If you see the letter 'c' before a split digraph, it always makes a soft sound (so it sounds like an 's' - like in the words 'race' and 'rice').

We have also been looking at how the letter 'y' can make the 'ee' sound (baby, lovely). We usually find this sound at the end of words.
