This Week's Subject: History

History allows our children to learn more about the world around them and how people and events have shaped societies. We give children a range of experiences and resources to support and enhance

their learning, exploring both primary and secondary objects and sources of information.

This half term, Year 5 are learning about World War 2 and the effect it had on the lives of people in Britain. Our children were very lucky to be given a detailed, first-hand explanation of life in Britain in this period by Ms Greathead's dad. He very kindly shared his experiences as a young boy living through the war.
