THIS WEEK IN PSHE

'a_e' is a split digraph and can be seen in words such as cake, frame and maze.

CURRICULUM CORNER

This Week's Subject: Computing



In Computing, children gain skills in three main areas: eSafety and the Internet, Digital Literacy and Computer Science. By exploring these areas, our pupils learn to use technology for a purpose in order to develop skills which will support them as they grow.

An integral part of this is developing an understanding of how algorithms underpin Computer Science. This starts in EYFS, where children learn how to organise instructions as an early stage of programming. This week, Reception enjoyed using BeeBots to develop their learning. They understood why they had to give instructions in a set order and began to debug these when they were given in the wrong order.
