### THIS WEEK IN PSHE

This week in assembly, we looked at where money comes from and what it is used for. We had a great discussion about how money doesn't grow on trees (although some children thought it did to begin with!) and the importance of being sensible and mature when it comes to spending money.

In PSHE lessons, we have continued to look at Living in the Wider World, which linked really well to Science Week and our children finding out about lots of different jobs involving science!



#### **Year 1 Phonics**

This week in Phonics we have looked at more alternative ways of making the 'ay' sound.

'a' by itself (e.g. apricot, apron, acorn) - This sound is often found at the beginning of words.

'ey' (e.g. grey, they, survey) - This sound is often found at the end of words.

We have also looked at words ending in the 've' sound (e.g. love, have, leave).

Can you think of any other words ending in 've'? See if you can spot them in your book or on signs!

This week we have been celebrating Science week. Our children have had so many exciting experiences to learn more about how Science can help us in the real world, how they can use these skills in the future and the potential careers available through Science.

Our younger children took part in a 'Silly Science' workshop. They were wowed with the experiments they saw and some children were able to assist with the impressive investigations including blasting rockets into the sky.
