


Dear Parents and Carers

THIS WEEK IN PSHE

This week in our PSHE assembly we talked about the sustainability of the environment, and how there is a limited supply of the earth's resources. We discussed the impact of this on our lives and the quality of people's lives around the world.

With our younger children, we have been thinking about the different kinds of people who work in our community. As Wednesday marked the start of Ramadan, we discussed this in class with the children and talked about how Muslims prepare for Eid.



Year One Phonics

This week in Phonics, Year 1 have been recapping Phase 3 and Phase 5 sounds and focusing on the 'ee' and 'ea' digraphs. A digraph is two letters which make one sound.

We have also looked at the tricky words 'could', 'should' and 'would'.

'ee' can be seen in words such as bee, feel, see and feet.

'ea' can be seen in words such as beak, treat, each and meal.

CURRICULUM CORNER

This Week's Subject: Maths



Our Maths curriculum places a strong emphasis on the development of key skills. We develop these within lessons and in regular practise in transitions throughout the day. We do this in order to give our pupils a strong foundation and

develop their confidence in Maths. Pupils are encouraged through the use of games and activities to practise skills.

In Year 4, we have a strong focus on multiplication. We aim to teach our children all of their multiplication facts up to 12 x 12. This week, pupils have practised facts for the 8 times table using our counting stick. They were incredible with this and some even had the chance to become the teacher! We then used games and Times Tables Rock Stars to practise our facts. The best way to embed these facts is through regular practise. All Year 4 children have been given a poster to help them remember their multiplication facts.
