CURRICULUM CORNER

This Week's Subject: Art

Our Art curriculum is based around a five-step process which enables the children to demonstrate the skills and techniques they have learnt. Within an Art topic, we start by **research**ing the artist or focus (for example, specific drawing techniques). This is then followed by **practising** the skill or technique that has been researched, before the children then **plan** and **make** their own interpretation/ piece. The children then **evaluate** their work and consider what they would do differently next time to improve the end product.



Year 4 have been practising different shading techniques, using different grades of pencil to add tone and shade to their drawings.

Year 6 have been creating work focusing on perspective, based on the work of L.S Lowry. They have **planned** and **made** their interpretations, drawing local buildings using the techniques used by Lowry himself.
