Year One Phonics

This week in Phonics

This week in Phonics, Year 1 have been revising Phase 3 sounds.

We have looked at:

'ee' - tree, bee, week
'igh' - light, night, bright
'oa' - soap, road, float
'oo' - scoop, moon, food

The digraph 'oo' also makes a 'u' sound like in hood, foot and good. If you see this sound, try it both ways to work out which one is right.

Can you read the following sentence?

Last night, a bee in a boat went up to the moon!

Look out for these sounds in your reading books!

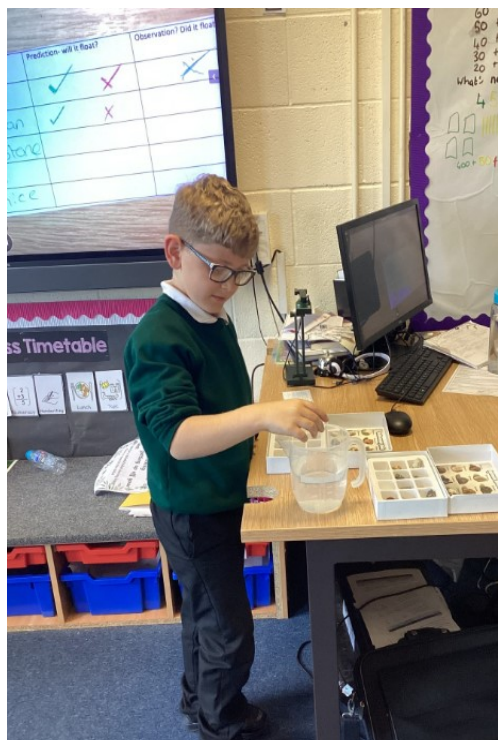
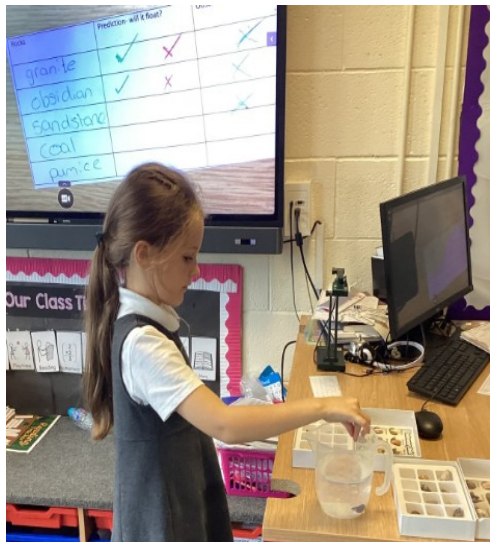




This Week's Subject: Science

In Science, children explore key concepts through investigations. These give pupils the opportunity to make a hypothesis and discuss their reasons for their ideas. They then test their predictions and reflect upon the results they find. We believe that investigative skills help pupils develop a natural curiosity and deepen their understanding.
