
Hello Parents and Carers!

We hope you have had a great week - our third back in school after Christmas already! This half term is flying!

The children have been working really hard once again - I have been lucky enough to see lots of fantastic writing this week! It is wonderful to see the effort the children are putting in, and how much they have come on over the course of this academic year.

Next week, we have our first Family Assembly of the year led by Year 4! We are really looking forward to sharing their learning with parents and carers.

Unfortunately, we are once again having lots of issues from social media spilling into school. Please remember that nearly all social media services require users to be at least 13 years of age to access and use their services, with users age 13-18 having to verify that they're using apps with a parent's permission. This includes Facebook, Snapchat, Twitter, Instagram, Tik Tok and Skype. Whilst there is no age restriction for watching videos on YouTube, users need to be 13 or older to have their own YouTube account (enabling them to subscribe to other channels, like videos, post comments, share their own content and flag inappropriate content). Users need to be 16 to use WhatsApp. This means no child at Wellesbourne Primary should be using any of the above apps.

CURRICULUM CORNER



This Week's Subject: Art

Our Art curriculum stimulates creativity and imagination. It provides visual, tactile and sensory experiences, and a special way of understanding and responding to the world. It enables children to communicate what they see, feel and think, through the use of colour, texture, form, pattern and different materials and processes. Children become involved in shaping their environments through art and design activities. Pupils are encouraged to make informed judgements, and aesthetic and practical decisions.

This half term Year 1 are exploring warm and cold colours. They are learning about different shades and names for each of the colours. They will then use this knowledge to make their own choices when making their final pieces.


