# **CURRICULUM CORNER**



#### This Week's Focus: Art


Art and design stimulates creativity and imagination. It provides visual, tactile and sensory experiences, and a special way of understanding and responding to the world. It enables children to communicate what they see, feel and think, through the use of colour, texture, form, pattern and different materials and processes. We follow a five-part sequence where children can explore art by **researching** an artist, **practising** the art skills being covered, **planning** their designs using previously-taught skills, **creating** their designs and **evaluating** their work so that they can identify what they have done well and what could be improved.

This half term, Year 2 have **researched** the artist 'Gakonga' and have **practised** drawing African animals using pastels to mix colours to create the backgrounds in a similar style to Gakonga.


