CURRICULUM CORNER

This Week's Subject: Art

Art and design stimulates creativity and imagination. It provides visual, tactile and sensory experiences, and a special way of understanding and responding to the world. It enables children to communicate what they see, feel and think, through the use of colour, texture, form, pattern and different materials and processes. We follow a five-part sequence where children can explore art by researching an artist, practising the art skills being covered, planning their designs using previously-taught skills, creating their designs and evaluating their work so that they can identify what they have done well and what could be improved.

Y6 have been learning about Banksy, a famous graffiti artist. They created beautiful pieces using a stencil technique and finished it off with their own 'tags'. Well done Year 6!


