CURRICULUM CORNER

This Week's Subject: Science

At Wellesbourne, scientific enquiry is at the core of our science lessons from EYFS to Year 6. Our **intention** is for our children to develop an intrinsic desire to question the way the world around them works. We want our children to **remember more**, **understand more** and **do more**. Science is a unique opportunity for children to explore, discover and investigate the world around them. A high-quality science education provides the foundations for understanding the world through the specific disciplines of biology, chemistry and physics. Science has changed our lives and is vital to the world's future prosperity, and all pupils should be taught essential aspects of the knowledge, methods, processes and uses of science.

This week, Year 3 have compared how objects move on different surfaces and learnt about how friction works. They used force metres to pull objects and recorded how much force was needed make them move.
