UKS2 Book Club's recommended read this week is 'The Breadwinner' by Deborah Ellis.

"We recently finished this book and we absolutely loved it - it is about an 11-year-old girl, Parvana, who becomes the breadwinner for her family in Taliban-era Afghanistan. When her father is taken away by the Taliban, Parvana has to transform herself into a boy in order to go out and earn money to buy food for her mother and younger

siblings. This book really made us think about how lucky we are - we would recommend it to children in Years 5 and 6."
