Hello Parents and Carers!

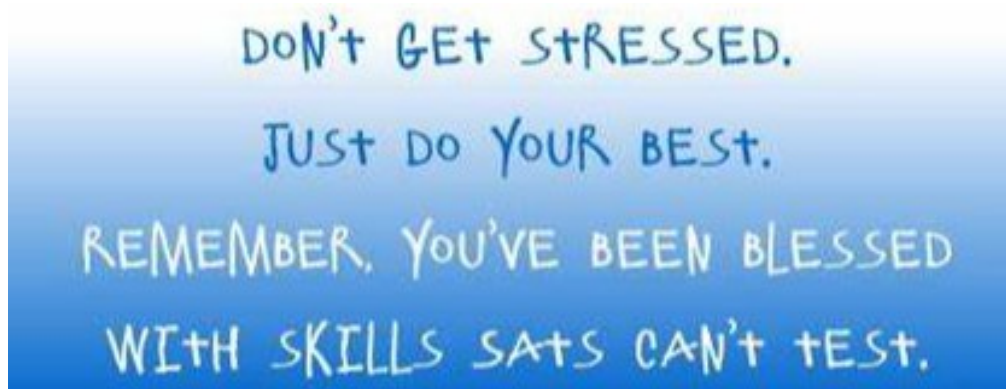

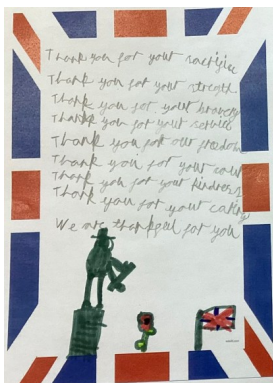




VE (Victory in Europe) Day Celebrations
