



Attendance and Punctuality

At Wellesbourne, we know that bringing your child to school every day on time is the most important thing you can do to improve your child's education. It is parents' and carers' legal responsibilities to ensure that they bring their children to school on time, every day that is possible. It is Wellesbourne Primary and Nursery School's responsibility to provide high-quality teaching and learning opportunities for children to access each day. Therefore when a child has 100% attendance, they access all learning opportunities and can reach their full potential.

Sometimes children may say they are sick if they are feeling tired or know they are doing something that day that isn't their favourite lesson.
