Hello Parents and Carers!

This week, we have held our annual Sports Days! These have taken place for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 on our school site, however unfortunately our KS2 Sports Day at St John Bosco had to be cancelled on Tuesday due to the rain. As we do not have a school field, we use St John Bosco's for our Sports Day, however as we walk the children to and from their school (a 20 minute walk each way), and are then outside on the field for a few hours, if it is rainy or very hot this puts us in a position where we cannot go. Over the next few weeks, each year

group will do Sports Day activities on site with Brian and Chloe, so they will not miss out completely. On Wednesday next week, our Year 6 children will have their Transition Day to their new secondary schools. On

this day, our Nursery-Y5 children will also go to their new classes during the afternoon to meet their new teacher. At the end of each academic year, we review the classes in each year group and make changes where necessary. When making these changes, we take into account friendships, attainment and general needs of the

children in the year group. We always ensure that each child is placed with somebody from their friendship group. As you can imagine, this is a task which means we cannot always please everybody, but please be assured it is done with the best interests of the children in mind. The classes are final and we cannot make changes to these. Next academic year, all of our teachers will be staying in their current year groups. The only changes we have are Miss Rose returning to Reception (who actually returns to school this Monday!) and, with Mrs Gerrard commencing her Maternity Leave at the beginning of the new school year, we have a new teacher - Miss Maguire - joining our team to replace her in Year 4. After transition on Wednesday, your child will come

home with a poster welcoming them to their new class - this contains some information about their new teacher and new year group. We wish our lovely Year 6s lots of luck on their first transition day at secondary

<u>PSHE</u>

At Wellesbourne, the intent of our PSHE curriculum is to deliver a curriculum which is accessible to all, and that will maximise the outcomes for every child, so that they know more, remember more and understand more. PSHE is embedded in all that we do to enable our children to become independent, responsible, healthy and confident members of society. Our PSHE curriculum has been built with the aim to support the development of the 'whole child', by helping them to understand how they are developing personally and socially as well as promoting their social, mental and physical development. Children will be able to develop the ability to tackle the moral, social and cultural issues that are part of growing up. Through our discreet lessons as well as wider cross-curricular approach to teaching PSHE, children are taught how to keep themselves safe, physically and emotionally, resulting in the acquisition of knowledge and skills, which enables children to access the wider curriculum. We provide our children with opportunities for them to learn about rights and responsibilities and appreciate what it means to be a member of a diverse society.

This week, our school have taken part in a sponsored relay alongside 14 of our local schools. This relay was in collaboration with #kNOwKnifeCrime and Cash for Kids, with the aim of raising awareness about knife crime and raising money for bleed control kits in our local area and to train our Y5 and Y6 children from the schools involved as Mini Medics. All children took part in the relay on site, with ten of our Y5 and Y6 children taking part in the relay itself alongside 150 other children. The ten children who took part were absolutely amazing, showcasing our school values at all times and showing brilliant resilience. You are all such amazing role models for our school and we are so proud of you! Our initial target was £2000; we have absolutely smashed this and are now at over £3000 (thanks to a very generous £1000 donation from Arriva Buses!).
