Modern Foreign Languages (MFL)

At Wellesbourne, we believe that a Modern Foreign Language prepares pupils to participate in a rapidly-changing world in which work and other activities are often carried out in languages other than English. The rise of


international commerce means that pupils need to be equipped with the skills needed in the international workplace. We intend to:

- foster an interest in learning other languages;
- introduce young children to another language in a way that is enjoyable and fun;
- make children aware that language has a structure, and that the structure differs from one language to another;
 - · help children develop their awareness of cultural differences in other countries;
 - · develop their speaking and listening skills;

· lay the foundations for future study.

Our children learn Spanish from Years 3-6. Our younger children are also exposed to Spanish regularly through 'incidental' Spanish - this means we have displays within our Early Years and KS1 classrooms, and we make reference to Spanish words for regular, common items on an adhoc basis (for example, answering the register in Spanish). Spanish is taught by an expert teacher, Margherita, who works for School Improvement Liverpool. Whilst Margherita teaches, our class teachers participate in the lesson alongside the children. Our MFL Subject Lead, Miss Greathead, also hosts a Spanish Cooking Club for children from Years 5 and 6.







Year 3 have loved their first year of learning Spanish! They update their working wall every week with the new vocabulary they have learnt.


