

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

At Wellesbourne, we have an Early Years setting consisting of a Nursery base and two Reception classes which follows the curriculum as outlined in the latest EYFS statutory framework.

The EYFS framework includes 7 areas of learning and development that are equally important and interconnected. However, three areas known as the prime areas are seen as particularly important for igniting curiosity and enthusiasm for learning, and for building children's capacity to learn, form relationships and thrive.


