#### THIS WEEK IN ASSEMBLY

**This week in KS2 PSHE Assembly, we focused on oceans and sustainability in recognition of World Oceans Day on 8th June. We talked about how we can protect our oceans and found out all about Boyan Slat, a Dutch inventor who founded The Ocean Cleanup after seeing plastic pollution while diving as a teenager. The organisation designs special systems to remove rubbish from oceans and stop more plastic entering rivers and seas.**

**In EYFS/ KS1 Story Assembly, we read 'The Cautionary Tale of the Childe of Hale', a story based on a 16th-century man called John Middleton from Hale Village who allegedly grew to a towering height of 9 foot 3 inches!
